

<p>Decoration</p>	<p>Egyptian façade, originally covered with a thin layer of plaster: two false fences and false windows, two semi-columns with Egyptian lotus capitals</p>
<p>Inscriptions</p>	<p>Greek epitaph on the right door jamb (only a few letters were left)</p>
