


Date of construction	Early Roman period? Façade of mudbrick: 2 nd century AD
Names of the deceased	Unknown
Construction material	Local limestone with later added façade of mudbrick
Number of burials	A least 4 (2 pits in each room)
Number of floors	1 on a high podium
Number of rooms	2
Number of niches	1 in the 1 st room

Decoration	Egyptian limestone façade: two columns with composite capitals, two false Egyptian fences on both sides of the door, three false windows
Inscriptions	Greek graffiti on a <i>tabula ansata</i> from the brick wall built in front of the façade during the 2 nd century AD: "Tombe de Ptolémaios, fils de Mousiaos, Alexandrin, rhéteur. Il mourut à l'âge de 20 ans, 6 mois, 26 jours. Bon courage." (Translation by E. Bernand)
