

Name of the deceased	Sophron and Theoandros, son of Isidoros
Construction material	Mudbrick
Number of burials	At least 2

Number of floors	2 (1st floor not excavated)
Number of rooms	2 plus front hall (2nd floor)
Number of niches	2nd floor: front hall: 1 in the east wall (originally 2?); eastern room: 2 small niches in the north and 2 in the south wall, 1 alcove in the north and 1 in the south wall (originally 3, destroyed by later entrance in the east wall?)
Decoration	Front hall: two columns in antis (destroyed), wall paintings imitating slabs of alabaster and red porphyry, above red slab bordered by zigzag pattern; first room: white orthostates, imitations of alabaster and red porphyry slabs (above), imitation of garlands with wine grapes and pomegranates (top); second room: destroyed except of floral designs on the door frame and two inscriptions (see below)
Inscriptions	"Memorial of his brother Sophron" and "Tomb of Theoandros, son of Isidoros" (after Perdrizet, actually destroyed)
