


Tomb no. GB 50 (tomb of Petosiris)

<p>Date of construction</p>	<p>Around 300 BC; reuse since the late Ptolemaic period with new constructions of mud brick in the west, east and south</p>
<p>Names of the deceased</p>	<p>Petosiris, Isonis and priest of Thoth</p>
<p>Construction material</p>	<p>Local limestone ('Muschelkalk')</p>
<p>Number of burials</p>	<p>1st period: at least 3; 2nd period: unknown</p>
<p>Number of floors</p>	<p>1</p>
<p>Number of rooms</p>	<p>2 plus later additions</p>
<p>Number of niches</p>	<p>None</p>
<p>Decoration</p>	<p>Façade and interior rooms are covered with Graeco-Egyptian and Egyptian reliefs</p>
